	Posting to CJNS Online	The goal of the CJNS is to post CJNS online for the 1 st of the month, in January, March, May, July, September and November. Should your article not be posted on CJNS online after the 1 st , please contact support@metapress.com .
	Posting to PubMed	Once a CJNS Issue and/or Supplement is posted within the CJNS online Journal, notification is provided to PubMed through Metapress. This notification may take up to one week from a Journal Issue or Supplement being uploaded to the CJNS online Journal. Upon receipt of notification, PubMed may take up to 72 hours to post Journal issues online. The goal is to have articles posted by the 15 th of the month, in January, March, May, July, September and November.
