We are seeking a qualified General Neurologist and a Stroke Neurologist to practice neurology at PRHC, while joining Queen's University Department of Medicine, Division of Neurology.

The successful candidate will be eligible for a competitive compensation package, including; an opportunity for income stability through an AFA, a generous benefit plan (medical, dental, life insurance, long-term disability, semi-private hospital, and out of country coverage), paid vacation time and a relocation package.

Community-based neurology practice working onsite at PRHC 46 weeks of the year:
